The burden of CVD and mental ill health (MIH) on work

Mortality: CVD main cause of death (42%) in the EU

Morbidity: 27% of EU population experience mental disorder p.a.



Costs CVD: €169 billion;

2.18 million working

years p.a. in EU25

Costs MIH: €240 billion;

€132 billion indirect

cost p.a. in EU25 → ★ ★



The relations between CVD and Mental III Health

MIH is an independent risk factor for CVD association is of similar magnitude to that of physical inactivity or high cholesterol



CVD can have adverse effects on the mental health prevalence of depression up to twice as high among patients with myocardial infarction up to 25%

Recommendations to Policy Making

Note facts

- -CVD and mental ill health are a burden to work
- -Work is a risk factor
- -Work is a setting for health promotion
- Workplace -Workplace health intervention are effective

Consider challenges

- Demographic & structural changes to work
- increasing health discrepancies in Europe
- increasing discrepancies in prevention

Advocate workplace health

- -Work Health issues integral to all policies
- -Public health view taken in work health issues
- -Monitoring the policy effects on workplace health
