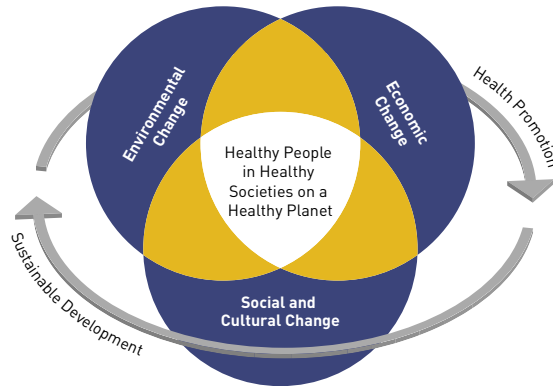


Geneva 2010: Joining forces for Health, Equity and Sustainable Development

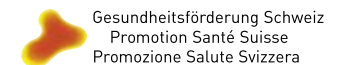

Research & Learning

Twenty sub-plenary sessions will be organised by the IUHPE Global Working Groups and other important stakeholders, addressing such issues as:

- social determinants of health,
- healthy and sustainable settings,
- role of impact assessment in promoting health,
- health, urbanisation and the built environment,
- sustainable financing and infrastructures for HP
- salutogenic pathways to health promotion,
- health promotion effectiveness;
- knowledge-based advocacy for policy, and
- challenges in evaluating complex interventions.

Dialogue & Capacity Building

Practitioners, researchers, decision-makers and students from key disciplines, institutions and networks will present their latest research, outcomes and practical experiences related to health promotion in general and to the conference topics in symposia, workshops, oral presentations, and posters.

"Meet the Author" sessions every morning will facilitate discussions with selected authors of recent publications on health promotion and sustainable development.

A number of additional side events and meetings will be organised prior, during and after the conference to promote collaboration, dialogue and exchange.

Creative Interaction

Creative and interactive learning methods such as "Open Space" and moderated electronic poster presentations will be introduced under the slogan "Take a Walk on the Wild Side" to provide participants, with a unique, inspiring learning experience and support outreach to other fields and networks.

Networking

This Conference will provide more than 2,000 participants representing the public and private sectors, and civil society with significant opportunities within the scientific and social programme to establish and strengthen their professional networks.

Call for Abstracts

Abstract submission (for symposia, workshops, oral presentations, posters, and innovative session formats) will open on August 31, 2009.

Abstract topics cover core health promotion issues and the crucial links between promoting health and the environmental, economic, urban, social and cultural changes that challenge people, societies and the planet. We invite abstracts that address one or more cross-cutting issues.
